



ACCREDITATION, APPROVAL, AND LICENSURE OF INSTITUTION AND PROGRAMS

History

In 1903, Lorain Business College was established as a private, co-educational college focused on higher business education. The College was located in downtown Lorain. From 1913 to 1980, the School operated under the management of C. L. Bair. Programs offered include Junior Accounting, Secretarial, Comptometer, Stenographic and Key punch. In 1980, the Julia Corporation purchases Lorain Business College and moved the campus North Ridge Road, Lorain. At that time the curriculum consisted of Executive Secretarial, Business Administration, Accounting, Secretarial and Junior Accounting. In July 1980, the School was authorized to confer Associate degrees in Business by the State Board of Career Colleges and Schools and in December 1980 the College was granted accreditation status by the Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools (ACICS).

In September 1982, A branch campus was opened in Sandusky offering the same programs as the Lorain campus. In 1993, the Julia Corporation changes the school name from Lorain Business College to Southeastern Business College to better fit with the schools owned in the southern part of the state.

In October 1997, Tri-State Educational Systems Inc. purchases the Lorain and Sandusky campuses from the Julia Corporation. Effective April 1998, the Schools' names are officially changed to Ohio Business College.

In December 2008, the Colleges received Provisional Authorization from the Ohio Board of Regents for the associate degrees.

In August 2010, the College received approval to offer the truck driving programs with the range portion of the program taking place at the Middletown location.
